


Twelth Sunday after Pentecost




Mark your calenders!

What is the Lutheran Liturgy?

Every Sunday, we Lutherans join with other Christians around the world and through the centuries to do the "worship of the people," the liturgy. Following a Prelude, the liturgy has four parts: Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending.

Beginning August 10, we will transition to a different set of musical pieces to celebrate the liturgy. The heart of this liturgical setting was composed by Richard Hillert (1923-2010). It was made familiar to many of you in the Lutheran Book of Worship (LBW) hymnal, published by Augsburg Fortress in 1978. This liturgical setting was carried forward into the ELW (2006) hymnal that we use at Messiah today.

It may take a few weeks to get back in the groove of singing ELW Setting Three, so give yourself grace! If this music is new to you, meditate on the words, and soon you will be joining in the chorus.

School Supplies for Kids Distribution:

We had a successful distribution of the school supplies on Saturday, Aug 16th! Thank you to everyone who helped with the program this year

for drivers who picked up the order at Walmart, for the counters who verified the shipment, for the many people who worked subassembling and packaging the correct items for each grade into 655 bags, and for the helpers on distribution day! The packaging was completed in four days – which is amazing! We dispersed over 615 bags of school supplies to around 140 cars that went through the line. The remaining bags are being given out to people who have left messages at the church needing supplies, and have been offered to each of the 5 county

schools that have started to date. The secretary emails the teachers to see if they have any students who need their supplies, and then email the results back to us and we deliver the grades needed to the schools. The plan is to only have a few left towards next year. Great job Messiah!!
